SAAC is honored to have been approved as a site location for The Maroon Volunteer Center AmeriCorps VISTA Project at Mississippi State University in Fall 2019.






ART EDUCATION & OUTREACH



Equal access to arts and arts education builds well-rounded thinkers and creative problem solvers. Initiatives in this program area provide early educational opportunities, summer scholarships, and create access through FREE public events.



ART IN THE PARK

is a free annual event that provides hands-on exposure for children (and families) to chalk, beads, clay, paint, drums, drawing, writing, theatre, dance, and more.



ART PARTNERS

is our after-school initiative that provides handson extracurricular art classes taught by working artists in collaboration with existing programs at four site partners: 1) J.L. King Center, 2) Pecan Acres, 3) Sudduth Extended Day, and 4) Youth Explosion.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

PumpkinPalooza is an annual familyoriented event sponsored by the Greater Starkville Development Partnership, held downtown each October, that includes trick-or-treating with merchants, pumpkin painting, and live music. SAAC sponsors the popular pumpkin painting booth.

Starkville Community Day is an annual event organized by various community members to provide a day and night of festivities and outreach at J.L.King Park. SAAC hosts its mural wall during the family-oriented part of the day.

BUSINESS SKILLS WORKSHOPS

Business Skills Workshops offers real-world, practical advice on treating art like a business. This series returns in FYE2021 as part of a collaborative \$kills for the Creative Economy partnership with YAC (Oxford).

COTTON DISTRICT ARTS FESTIVAL

The Cotton District Arts Festival, consistently named Best Fair/Festival by Mississippi Magazine, showcases the best talent in arts, music, food, and more, from across the Southeast. Although disrupted by COVID-19, CDAF2020 explored a new partnership with MSU and Humphrey Coliseum for a condensed, inclement-weather alternative. Because CDAF uncoupled from Super Bulldog Weekend in April (due to the Easter Weekend scheduling), we had the rare opportunity to use an unoccupied Hump. We are extraordinarily grateful for this effort.



PUBLIC ART

Public art creates a sense of character and creates clear visibility for Starkville and the arts. SAAC continues to collaborate with the MSU Department of Art, the city, and other partners on public art.

SUNDAY FUNDAY

Sunday Funday: This grassroots community event, created by artists, is a former SAAC grantee. SAAC now serves as "fiscal sponsor": Sunday Funday controls its program and SAAC provides financial oversight, which, in turn, gives donors a potential charitable deduction.

STAY AT HOME FEST MS

In response to COVID-19, SAAC reopened its grant pool. In collaboration with the Del Rendon Foundation and other community partners and arts organizations, this endeavor created free public arts programming and education opportunities on Facebook through the Stay At Home Fest MS.

Artists from all over MS provided all sorts of artistic content (performances, readings, workshops, demonstrations, etc.) that showed their craft and/or serves artistic and/or educational purposes.

As of June 30, 2020, SAAC and DRF have awarded more than \$3,000 to 25+ locally-based artists.


How do we support ourselves?
