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Untitled!

A works-in-progress reading series between SAAC and SCT!

STARKVILLE, MS -

SAAC joined forces with SCT to create *Untitled!*, a new project for local artists to practice drafts of works-in-progress before a live audience. No sets, no props, no feedback, just practice runs. Through *Untitled!*, writers, actors, singers, songwriters, and performers will present ten minutes of work, on stage, open to the public. Anyone may sit in the audience, at no cost, on a first-come first-served basis.

Untitled! gives artists an opportunity to test and explore developing works, and is not strictly limited to a particular genre. Examples of eligible works include: essays, poetry, script, songs, prose, or even dance performance... diversity is encouraged. Actors can utilize this opportunity to strengthen their cold reading skills: to participate, they will need to arrive 30 minutes before the official start time to be “cast” in a reading. Singers and songwriters who participate must provide their own basic instrumental needs.

Submissions may be made online, prior to each show, where 5-6 works will be selected to perform. Selection will be based on merit of content and contribution to the diverse community of the Starkville area.

John W. Bateman, Executive Director of SAAC, and Gabe Smith, Chief Administrative Officer of SCT, hope that *Untitled!* will help connect Starkville and Oktibbeha County with local artists and provide a forum for growth. Specifically, Bateman says: “Reading drafts helps writers and performers exercise and build their craft. This series gives a wide range of creatives a chance to develop works and meet other talent. Because feedback is not part of the format, this isn’t a traditional salon and really opens the door to build raw works. The community audience gets to experience and be a part of that amazing process.”

“SCT is proud to be a host venue for fresh compositions from local talent,” said Smith. “Not only is this a chance for homegrown artists to showcase their voices, it brings additional life into our playhouse and gives performers a low-stakes, high-energy way to stretch their acting muscles and become hands-on participants in the creation of new work.”

Spring dates for *Untitled!* will be: January 19, 2018, February 23, 2018, March 23, 2018, and April 27, 2018. Readings begin at 7:30 p.m.; actors must arrive by 7:00 p.m.
